
Where are all the August babies?



DELICIOUS DISHES

This bold and flavorful Grilled Cola Chicken recipe below, from www.letsdishrecipes.com, is sure to be a new family favorite. The amazing BBQ sauce would also be great on all kinds of grilled meats.

The necessary ingredients are as follows:

1) 1 tbsp. olive oil

2)1 clove of garlic, minced

3)1 cup cola

4)1/3 cup ketchup

5)1 tbs. apple cider vinegar

6)1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce

7)1.5 tsp. chili powder

8) 1 tbs. brown sugar

9)2 tsp. paprika

10) 1/2 tsp. salt

11) 1/4 tsp. pepper

12) 1/2 tsp. ground cumin

13) 6 boneless, skinless chicken

breast halves

Directions:

- 1) Preheat the grill for medium-high heat
- 2) In a medium saucepan, heat the oil over medium heat, add garlic and sauté for 1-2 minutes. Stir in ingredients 3 7.
- 3) Bring to a boil, then reduce heat and simmer for 15 minutes (until sauce reduces and thickens). Remove 6 tbs. of sauce and set aside.
- 4) In a small bowl, combine ingredients 8 12. Rub the spice mixture over the chicken, place on grill and baste with 3 tbs. of the reserved sauce.
- 5) Cook for 5 minutes, turn chicken and baste with the remaining reserved sauce. Cook for an additional 5 minutes, or until it is cooked through.
- 6) Serve with remaining sauce.
